Why Nonprofit Training Matters

Five Common Problems That Happen When Boards and Leaders Are Not Trained

Most nonprofit challenges are not caused by bad intentions. They are caused by good people being asked to lead complex organizations without the tools, language, and training needed to succeed. But nonprofit leadership is a specialized skill set and without training, even the most caring organizations can struggle with confusion, burnout, conflict, and instability.

Here are five of the most common problems nonprofits experience when board members and leaders have never received nonprofit governance training.

1. Confusion Between Governance and Management

One of the biggest challenges in nonprofits is understanding the difference between the role of the board and the role of staff.

Without training:

- Board members may unintentionally micromanage
- Staff may feel undermined or unsupported
- Important boundaries become unclear
- Decision-making slows down
- Tension develops between leadership and operations

2. Weak Financial Oversight
